



Community Planning & Development

Strengthens the practice of planning and community development through independent research, technical assistance, and civic education and engagement. Works in partnership with public, private and nonprofit organizations, local governments, and development and planning professionals.

Demographic, Geographic Data & Analysis

Makes available U.S. Census information and other demographic and geographic data. A leader in the use of information technology, particularly geographic information systems (GIS). Researchers provide data analysis, mapping and programming services, technical assistance and training.

Economic Development

Conducts research and offers technical assistance on urban and regional economic issues of interest to local, state, and national policymakers. Primary focus areas include regional economic analysis, regional indicators, economic impact analysis, innovation and entrepreneurship, manufacturing competitiveness, and the role of urban universities in regional development.

Energy Policy

Helps overcome social and institutional barriers to the implementation of solutions to energy challenges by providing an objective channel for the free exchange of ideas, the dissemination of knowledge, and the support of energy-related research in the areas of public policy, economics, business and social science.

Environment & Sustainability

Identifies and seeks solutions to help heal and preserve the natural environment and plan and operate sustainable cities.

Nonprofit Management

Supports and fosters the health of the nonprofit sector through training and technical assistance that support the role of nonprofits in civil society; scholarly and applied research; and undergraduate and graduate education in the leadership and management of nonprofit organizations.

Public Management & Finance

Provides technical assistance to governments, civic groups, and nonprofit organizations in such areas as strategic planning and fiscal analysis. Helps solve financial problems related to environmental facilities and resources to create sustainable environmental systems in the public and private sectors.
